E-SAFETY... Have you heard about ... Nomophobia

Definition: Although not yet in the dictionary, Nomophobia is the term being given to the anxiety sufferers feel when they are unable to use their mobile phones. A recent study by UK based firm SecurEnvoy claimed that 66% of mobile owners are hooked on checking their devices for alerts and updates. They go on to warn that this addiction is leading to a decline in the ability to engage in face-to-face conversations. This addictive behaviour can also lead to problems of withdrawal, which in turn could cause problems in the classroom. Students could show a lack of interest, become distracted and indeed become disruptive without the comfort of their mobile phone.

Advice: While this appears to be a growing phenomenon, until there is greater understanding about ways to help, sufferers should perhaps be given the same consideration as they would with any other addiction. In the classroom this will present a particular challenge, not least in first identifying that a student may actually be an addict. If a student is addicted to their mobile phone, they may struggle to engage in the classroom. However, it would not be practical to allow them to continue to use it during teaching time. Teaching students about responsible and reasonable use of mobiles, setting time limits for use, switching the phone off at night etc., may also help those who are finding themselves becoming more and more attached to their phone.
