#### AGE LIMIT CHANGE

Since may 2016, it will be in the European Union, including the UK. Prior to this, the minimum age was 13, which still applies for the rest of the world. WhatsApp has not yet stated whether it will take action against anyone aged between 13 and 16 who already hold accounts under the old terms and conditions,

#### SCAM MESSAGES

From unauthorised third parties or from fraudsters protending to offer prizes to 'lucky people' encouraging recipients to click on a link to win a prize. A common scan involves messages warning recipients that their WhatsApp subscription has run out with the hope that people are duped into providing their payment details. Other scan messages include instructions to forward the message in funder of the without the message in another perce-

#### THE 'ONLY ADMIN' FEATURE AND CYBERBULLYING

AND CYBERBULLYING berbullying is the act of sending threatening or taunti t messages, voice messages, pictures and videos, with

aim to hurt and humiliate the receiver. The group chat and group video call features are great for multiple people to chat simultaneously, but there is the potential for people to hurt others with their comments or jokes. The 'only admin 'feature gives the admin of a group chat greater control over who can send messages. Whilst this can be good for one-way announcements, the group admin has the power to block somehode from responding to an offensive message in a chat.

#### LIVE LOCATION SHARING

WhatsApp's Live Location 'reature enables users to share their current location in real time to their contacts in a chat, allowing friends to show their movements. The feature, which can be ound by pressing the 'attach' button, is described by WhatsApp as a 'simple and secure way to let people know where you are.' Location-sharing is already a common feature on other social apps, including Snapchat's Snap Map and Facebook Messenger and can be a useful way for a child to let loved ones know they are safe. 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dvise your child not to tap, share or forward any message that looks suppicious or sounds too good to be true. When your hild receives a message from an unknown number for the first time, they will be given the opticn to report the number as pam directly inside the chat. They can also report a contact or a group as spam using the following steps: 1) Open the chat. 2)Tap on the contact or group name to open their profile information. 3) Scroll to the bottom and tap 'Report Spam.'

#### LEAVE A GROUP

IT your child is part of a group chat that makes them teel uncomfortable or has been added to a group they don't want i be part of, use the group's settings to show them how to leave If someone exits a group, the admin can add them back in onc If they leave again, they cannot be added again.

#### USING LIVE LOCATION SAFELY

in your child needs to use the tote cotation reactive to share vith you or a friend, advise them to only share it for the amount of time they need to. WhatsApp gives the options of either 15 minutes, one hour or eight hours. However, your child can choose to stop sharing at any time.

### DELETE ACCIDENTAL

f your child has sent a message to the wrong chat I'f a message they sent has contained a mistake, they can delete it. To do this, simply tap and hold on the message, choose "Delete' and then "Delete for everyone." The app allows seven minutes to delete the message after it has been sent, but it is important to smember that recipients may have seen and screenshold a

#### SET TIME LIMITS

A 2017 study tound that by the age of 14 the average child will have sent more than 35,000 texts, 30,000 WhatSApp messages and racked up more than three solid weeks of ideo chat. Although it is inevitable that your child will use technology, you can still set boundaries. This is not easy, especially since teens use their devices for both choolwork and free time, often simultaneously.

### READING ...

As a school our expectation is that every child reads ideally every day [little and often is always better] but at least 5 times a week.

### What does 5 times a week look like?

It looks like 5 separate days ... it is okay to read in a morning before school and when you get home but this counts as one day.

It looks like 5 separate times ... in the reading record books there should be separate entries; the teachers usually do a daily check as to whether the child has read at home and recorded the pages they have read [parents recording in Reception, Y1 and Y2]. A lot of classes have their own recording system for who has read at home to help when it comes to the reading treat box on a Friday.
