

E-Safety: Social media is as harmful as alcohol and drugs for young people ...

The word "addiction" brings to mind alcohol and drugs. Yet, over the past 20 years, a new type of addiction has emerged: addiction to social media. It may not cause physical harms, such as those caused by tobacco and alcohol, but it has the potential to cause long-term damage to our emotions, behaviour and relationships.

Young people have embraced the digital age, using technology to relax and interact with others. Social media is a big deal – it is a lifeline to the outside world. Although people of all ages use social media, it is more harmful for younger users than it is for older people.

The harm lies in their <u>change in behaviour</u>. Their addiction means spending increasing amount of time online to produce the same pleasurable effect, and it means social media is the main activity they engage in above all others. It also means taking away attention from other tasks, experiencing unpleasant feelings from reducing or stopping interaction with social media.

We should also be concerned about the effect of social media on sleep and doing less "offline", such as making time for homework and direct face-to-face social interaction. It has also been linked to depression and loneliness, both of which may be the cause or the effect of social media addiction.
