Vocabulary	Meaning
alms bowl	Money, food, or other donations given to the poor or needy
begging bowl	A bowl held out by a beggar for food or donations
Budhism swastika	The swastika or sauwastika is a geometrical figure and an ancient religious icon in the cultures of Eurasia. It is used as a symbol of divinity and spirituality in Indian religions.
butter lamp	A lamp that is a conspicuous feature of Tibetan Buddhist temples and monasteries throughout the Himalayas.
dharma wheel	The circular shape of the wheel symbolizes the perfection of Buddha's teachings.
mandala	A circular figure representing the universe in Hindu and Buddhist symbolism.
thangka	Is a Tibetan Buddhist painting on cotton, silk appliqué, usually depicting a Buddhist deity, scene, or mandala.
Vesak	The most important Buddhist festival, taking place at the full moon when the sun is in the zodiacal sign of Taurus, and commemorating the birth, enlightenment, and death of the Buddha.

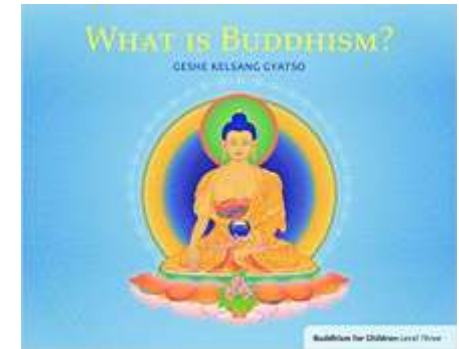
