Vocabulary

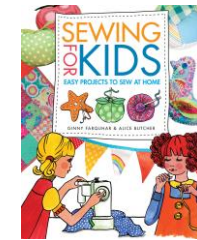
aesthetic	How visually appealing something is. Is it nice to look at?

backstitch	A type of stitch that involves looping back over the patch you have stitched.
decorate	To make something better by improving with a new pattern or colour.
design	A plan for making a final project.
fabric	Material that is used to create furnishings.
functional	Is something is functional, it is practical and has a purpose.
needle	A small metal stick used to put thread through to sew.
overstitch	A type of stitch where you loop the thread over the edge of the fabric.
running stitch	A simple stitch where the thread runs up and down through the fabric.
sewing	The process of using a needle and thread to create a design or fix fabric together.
thread	Thin string used to put through the needle for sewing.
