



Music - Year 4 - spring - Stop!

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Vocabulary	Meaning
composition	A piece of music that someone has written.
conductor	Someone who directs a performance of musicians or a piece of music.
dynamics	Changes in loudness in a piece of music
ensemble	A group of musicians who regularly play together.
improvisation	A performance that a musician has not practised or planned.
pitch	To express or set something at a particular level.
pulse	A steady beat.
rhythm	A strong pattern of sounds or musical notes that is used in music and dancing.
tempo	The speed at which a piece of music is played.
texture	The <u>character</u> of a <u>piece</u> of <u>music</u>
timbre	A quality of sound that makes voices or musical instruments sound different from each other.
stave	The five <u>lines</u> and four <u>spaces</u> between them on which <u>musical</u> notes are written
vocal	Relating to or produced by the voice in singing.




Sing in unison with clear diction, controlled pitch and sense of phrase.

Play an instrument and perform parts in a range of solo and ensemble contexts with increasing accuracy and expression.

Repeat back pitch and rhythm.
