

<b>TERM:</b> Summer 1 2018	<b>CLASS:</b> Year 3	<b>TOPIC:</b> Prehistoric Britain
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We will be continuing our topics from spring 2, due to the snow and our residential trip to Dukeshouse Wood.

<b>ENGLISH:</b> Aiming to inspire children to read and write like an author, English will be taught through a love of books and will cover various aspects of fiction, non-fiction, poetry, spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPaG) during the term.	<b>MATHEMATICS:</b> Will be taught in an exciting, motivating and interactive way for children to become competent mathematicians developing skills in mental calculation, using and applying number, measures, shape and space and data handling while following Maths No Problem.	<b>SCIENCE:</b> Digging deep to unearth a fascinating view of rocks, soils and fossils above and below ground. Children will find out about different rocks and what they can be used for, explore a variety of soils and find out how they are formed, discovering a world of fossils and undertaking a variety of science experiments
<b>COMPUTING:</b> Through the reading of Fantastic Mr Fox, children will explore a series of tunnels that helps them understand the complicated system of computer networks, identifying how computers networks, including the internet can provide multiple services.	<b>HISTORY:</b> A journey through a million years of prehistory. Starting with the Stone Age and going right through to the end of the Iron Age, children will discover how humans first came to Britain, how they lived and what developments were made in each era.	<b>GEOGRAPHY:</b> Taking a trek into the depths of the jungle, children will explore the incredible world of the rainforest. Discovering where the rainforests are, what they are like, who lives in rainforests, and many more activities that are sure to fire up their imagination.



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<b>LANGUAGES [FRENCH]:</b> Children will be looking at how to introduce the different members of their family in French. Building on previous knowledge and language, children will add the necessary vocabulary to introduce their father, mother and other family members.	<b>P.E.:</b> Our swimming lessons will continue this term on a Tuesday. We are aiming for everyone to achieve a minimum of 25 m ☺ On Friday, Mrs Burroughs will be developing our rounders skills.	<b>R.E.:</b> Finding out what makes the Bible the best-selling book of all time, the class will have the chance to discuss books which are special to them before looking at how Christians use the Bible at church and at home. Delving deeper, they will find out how it is organised and compare the different genres written in the book.
<b>MUSIC:</b> We will have a specialist teacher coming into school to teach us how to play the violin. We will learn basic chords and songs. We will also be learning new songs in a weekly assembly.	<b>ART &amp; DESIGN:</b> Exploring the art made by early <i>Homo Sapiens</i> in Europe during the last Ice Age, children will look to sculpt their own prehistoric creature into a more modern material to imitate the carvings made in bones and antlers.	<b>DESIGN &amp; TECHNOLOGY:</b> We will be revisiting our previous topic of the Trojan Horse and looking at how triangular struts can help support our structures. We will also be using a variety of tools to attach wheels to our Horse.
