


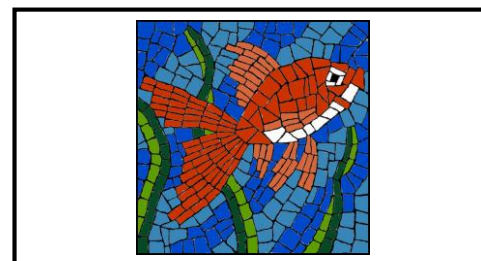
Art – Year 4 – autumn 2 - Investigating patterns

Vocabulary	Meaning
alternate	To take in turns and follow one another.
cement	The material that holds the tiles on a mosaic, like a glue.
design	A decorative pattern.
gradient	A colour going from light to dark in shade.
horizontal	Lines going across from side to side, like the horizon line.
mosaic	An art style that involves sticking lots of small tiles to form a picture.
motif	The part of the pattern that gets repeated.
pattern	When a design has lines, shapes, colours that are repeated.
pottery	Dishes, Vases and objects made from baked clay.
silhouette	The dark shape and outline of a figure.
tiles	Small pieces of baked clay, used to make a mosaic.
vertical	Lines going straight up and down.

A pattern is usually colourful and includes at least 2 colours. Artwork styles are different, in different countries around the world. <p>Skills:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use a pencil to colour in. Create a pattern by alternating colours. Draw shapes and lines using a ruler.
