
Vocabulary				
atlas	A book of maps.			
climate	The general weather conditions that are typical.			
climate zone	Sections of the Earth divided according to climate.			
compass points	Any of the main points on a compass; N, NE, E, SE, S, SW, W, NW.			
continent	A large area of land that consists of many countries.			
country	An area of land controlled by its own government.			
desert	A large area of land, usually hot, where there is almost no rain, water or plants.			
globe	A ball shaped object with a map of the world on it.			
human geography	Features of land that have been impacted by human activities.			
language	The communication of a particular country or group of people.			
ocean	One of the 5 very large areas of salt water on the Earth's surface.			
Physical geography	Natural features of the land.




Knowledge
